AKJKAQ Winter Camp 2010

The practice of reverse blocking and movement sequences in a variety of stances tested not only our coordination, but also our concentration. Sunday's training was reserved for brown and black belts. Once again, Sensei Mori was able to draw a maximum of intensity and concentration from participants through his imposing presence and his own concentration which require karatekas to never lose their focus or awareness. The effort goes well beyond mere physical exertion, bringing together the mind, intensity (spirit) and technique.


This year the JKA SKDI summer seminar was held at Mitchell College in New London, Connecticut. The training, which lasted from Wednesday to Sunday, brought together karatekas from Canada, the United States, Haiti, Colombia, Venezuela, India and last but not least Japan. For five straight days all participants trained vigorously in the summer heat – a collective body and mind forging experience. Masataka Mori Sensei, 8th Dan, presided the seminar while Toshihiro Mori Sensei, 7th Dan, and Yasunori Ogura Sensei, 7th Dan, were the guest instructors from Japan. Both guest instructors were 1980 and 1986, respectively, All Japan Karate Championship kumite champions. Toshihiro Mori Sensei awed the entire class with his stance breaking sweeps followed by lightning fast punch combinations – unquestionable *ippon*. Yasunori Ogura Sensei left an imprint in everyone's mind with his fluidity of motion and powerful *kime* while performing kata. As the week was coming to a close, a goodwill tournament was organized followed by a barbeque on the beach. As the sun set, karatekas were still busy enjoying the great company of their fellow students. Finally, after a grueling Sunday morning training given by Masataka Mori Sensei, it was time for the Dan examination. Karatekas tested for Shodan up to Godan. The summer camp was a success once again and helped strengthen not only everybody's technique but also the friendship ties between all karatekas. DOJO PROFILE

Our Dojo is located on beautiful Pender Island (population 2000) between Vancouver Island and mainland BC (http://www.penderisland.info/). Islanders have a strong sense of community. High school students travel by water taxi to Saltspring Island. We have a volunteer fire department and know our 2 RCMP officers personally. The Orca whales pass 50 feet off shore and sunsets can be spectacular.

The community also has Shiatsu, Reiki, massage, Yoga, meditation groups, Tai Chi, and Kobudo. I try to relate the lessons of the mind and body in the Dojo. Making connection between your realizations in the Dojo and your every day life makes Karate real and relevant to your life. This was the theme of the Pender Island Black Belt retreat weekends that were held a few years ago.

In our dojo, a person receives their 3rd Kyu and their first degree in Reiki, a healing art studying the connection between the energy that underlies movements, yielding, and intuition. Many Masters studied calligraphy or flower arranging, or some other yin study. Your Karate studies can be so much more than what you physically see in the Dojo.

This is my 40th year in Karate. More and more I see myself as a student of life's lessons. One thing that I would like to pass on would be the realization of the need of compassion in all things, including the study of Karate.
